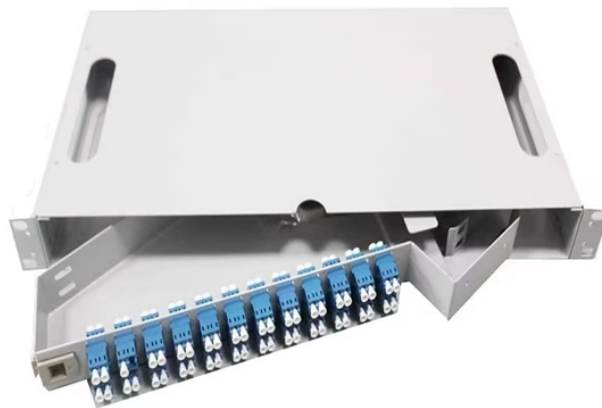


Ag Passive Optical Network

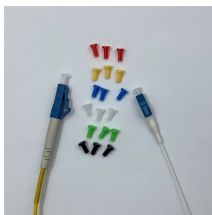
