Because service entrance conductors are unprotected until the main disconnect, NEC requires that they be routed to minimize exposure and physical damage. 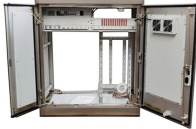
It has a wiring chamber, with provisions for conduit entrances and exits, and a means of sealing the meter in place. The word "socket" in these Standards refers to meter socket.

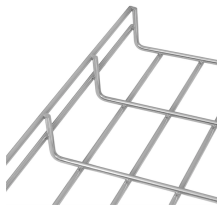

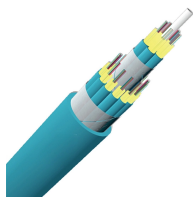
As for the equipment inside, there are certain differences: the first level distribution cabinet generally has isolation switches, circuit breakers, leakage protectors, etc., the second level ...
