Most Category 5 cables are unshielded, relying on the balanced line twisted pair design and differential signaling for noise suppression. 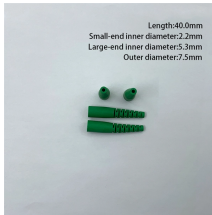
